OUR ADVISORY BOARD HAS EXCLUSIVELY FOCUSED ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF HILLSGROVE CLUBHOUSE AND THIS NEW WORK GROUP WILL FOCUS ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF ADDITIONAL CLUBHOUSES IN RHODE ISLAND. THIS HAS BEEN A STRONG INTEREST OF MULTIPLE ADVISORY BOARD MEMBERS AND STARTED TO GARNER INTEREST AND SUPPORT FROM STAKEHOLDERS.

I AM EXCITED ABOUT THE PROSPECT OF MORE CLUBHOUSES IN RHODE ISLAND. AS MANY OF OUR READERS KNOW, MOST OF MY CAREER WAS SPENT IN MASSACHUSETTS WHICH HAS OVER 32 ACCREDITED CLUBHOUSES AND MORE THAT ARE PURSUING ACCREDITATION. WITH CLUBHOUSES ALL OVER THE STATE, MOST PROSPECTIVE MEMBERS HAVE AT LEAST ONE CLOSE BY. ACCESS TO A CLUBHOUSE IS CRITICALLY IMPORTANT AND A SAFETY NET FOR MANY INDIVIDUALS LOOKING FOR COMMUNITY ORIENTED MENTAL HEALTH RECOVERY SUPPORT. THERE IS TREMENDOUS COLLABORATION BETWEEN THE MASSACHUSETTS CLUBHOUSES AND A STRONG COALITION. THIS HAS HELPED TO CREATE STATEWIDE LEADERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES FOR CLUBHOUSE MEMBERS. HILLSGROVE CLUBHOUSE IS FORTUNATE TO BE ABLE TO SERVE ALL OF RHODE ISLAND AND I HAVE GREAT RESPECT FOR THE THOSE MEMBERS THAT TRAVEL MORE THAN AN HOUR TO GET HERE FROM ALL CORNERS OF THE STATE. IT IS AN HONOR TO BE THE PROGRAM OF CHOICE FOR SO MANY, NOW OVER 175 ACTIVE MEMBERS AND HUNDREDS OF ALUMNI MEMBERS. I ALSO KNOW THAT HAVING A CLUBHOUSE IN YOUR LOCAL COMMUNITY IS IDEAL. FOR MANY PEOPLE, THE COMMUTE TO WARWICK IS TOO LONG, TOO FAR AWAY, TOO UNFAMILIAR. THERE ARE THOSE IN NEED THAT CANNOT OVERCOME THIS BARRIER. A CLUBHOUSE CLOSE BY IS THE ANSWER.

OUR FIRST MEETING WILL BEGIN TO FORMALIZE A CONVERSATION THE ADVISORY BOARD HAS BEEN DISCUSSING FOR SEVERAL MONTHS. AS WE GET STARTED, WE WILL BE DRAFTING A PLAN, SEEKING SUPPORTERS, IDENTIFYING CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES. WE DO NOT KNOW WHERE THIS EFFORT WILL TAKE US, BUT I AM EXCITED TO BE A PART OF THE DISCUSSION, HOLDING HOPE FOR THE POSSIBILITY OF MULTIPLE COLLABORATING CLUBHOUSES IN RHODE ISLAND.

Unfortunately, as we end the month of October and head into November, the federal government shutdown continues. One of the consequences of the continued shutdown is the SNAP (Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program; aka food stamps) benefits for November have been canceled. This negatively impacts the vast majority of members who depend upon these SNAP benefits to meet their food needs for the month. The loss in benefits worsens the food insecurity that members experience already, forcing them to make difficult decisions between paying rent, utility, or medical bills, etc. A reminder to all Hillsgrove Clubhouse members that we have free lunch Monday thru Friday while also serving dinner a few evenings monthly at social events. Additionally, Hillsgrove Clubhouse will be a collection location for Thrive's New Food & Home Supply. If members need support locating community food programs, do not hesitate to contact the clubhouse. In spite of the previous struggles, members continue to show relevancy by continuing attending the clubhouse, going to classes, working, and socializing. New member Kimberly is an example of the previous. She brings a long employment and education experience to HC. She earned two college degrees from local colleges while working in retail for 13 years. Kimberly has used her educational and work experience by learning and working in a variety of work-ordered-day (WOD) tasks. These tasks include doing reception, billing, monthly/daily attendance and co-facilitating Community and Unit Meetings. Kimberly has been very consistent in her HC attendance quickly becoming an integral member of the Admin. Team. Adam and George continue to make daily contributions to the front-of-the-house (FOH). George has contributed to the FOH WOD learning to answer phones, circulate birthday, get well, and miss you cards. He enjoys participating in social activities most recently going to Mystic Village where he purchased some postcards, coffee, and a donut. George has a marvelous sense of humor and a quick wit.
